REGULAR MEETING
SANTA ANA BOARD OF EDUCATION

May 11, 2010

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Board President Yamagata-Noji. Other members in attendance were Mr. Richardson, Mr. Hernández, and Mr. Palacio, and Mr. Reyna.

Cabinet members present were Ms. Russo, Dr. Olsky, Mr. Bishop, Mr. Lopez, Mr. Mendez, Mr. Ayala, Ms. Lohnes, and Mr. Dixon.

RECESS TO CLOSED SESSION

PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS

Board President Yamagata-Noji asked those wishing to address the Board in matters pertaining to Closed Session to step to the podium.

The parent of Student ID #149722 addressed the Board to request an opportunity. The Board asked questions of parent and student. The parent was informed that a decision would be announced later in the meeting.

An advocate for Student ID #309359 addressed the Board, neither parent or student were in attendance. Discussion ensued.

RECONVENE OPEN MEETING

The Regular meeting reconvened at 7:25 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Adrian Hernández, student from MacArthur Fundamental School.

SUPERINTENDENT'S COMMENTS

Dr. Noji welcomed everyone to the meeting and shared that last evening, the Association of California School Administrators Region 17 held their 20th Annual Leadership Awards dinner where they honored many key individuals. Of all the award winners, there were four from Santa Ana Unified School District. First being awarded was Superintendent Jane Russo; also awarded was Secondary Principal Greg Rankin, Director of Curriculum, Staff Development, Special Projects Frances Byfield who received the Tracy Gaffey Award, and Antonette Roberto received the confidential employee of the year award.

Superintendent Russo introduced Valley High School student Bryan Galvan. Bryan is the SAUSD Art Song Men's Division first place winner who performed a solo Mattinata by Ruggiero Leoncallao. Bryan is also the runner up in the Southern California Rotary Young Singer of the Year Competition. Following his performance, the top cast members of Valley High School's musical Beauty and the Beast performed a medley.

Santa Ana High School Senior Lizette Tenorio was called to the podium. She placed second in the nation at the Girl's High School Wrestling National Championships in Oklahoma City. She is a two-time CIF champion and was a

state champion in 2009. This year, Lizette placed third in the girl's state wrestling meet. In addition, Lizette is a two-time Golden West League Champion in Girl's shot put and discus. She has been offered a wrestling and track and field scholarship to attend Jamestown College in North Dakota.

Thanks was given to the committed partners such as the Kevin Armstrong, M.D. Memorial Sports Foundation, the City of Santa Ana, and to the school community including teachers, coaches, assistant coaches, and classified staff members. It was moved by Mr. Palacio, seconded by Mr. Richardson, and carried 3-0, Mr. Hernández and Mr. Reyna were not present, to approve the Head Start eligibility, recruitment, selection, enrollment and attendance policies and procedures for 2010-11 program year, not 2009-10 as printed on the agenda.

5.0 APPROVAL OF REGIONAL OCCUPATIONAL PROGRAM (ROP) ADULT FEE-BASED CLASSES

It was moved by Mr. Hernández, seconded by Mr. Richardson, and carried 5-0, to approve the Regional Occupational program adult fee-based classes.

3.0 APPROVAL OF SELECTION OF ONE OF THE FOUR INTERVENTION MODELS FOR EACH SCHOOL IDENTIFIED AS PERSISTENTLY LOW-ACHIEVING AS REQUIRED BY THE FEDERAL SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT GRANT

6.0 AUTHORIZATION TO OBTAIN BIDS FOR RENTAL, PURCHASE, RELOCATION, DISMANTLE AND REMOVAL OF DEPARTMENT OF STATE ARCHITECT APPROVED CLASSROOM AND RESTROOM PORTABLES DISTRICTWIDE

9.0 APPROVAL OF FIRST AMENDMENT TO JOINT USE AGREEMENT AND COVENANT BY AND BETWEEN SAUSD AND CITY OF SANTA ANA

It was moved by Mr. Hernández, seconded by Mr. Palacio, and carried 5-0, to approve the first amendment to the Joint Use Agreement and Covenant by and between Santa Ana Unified School District and the City of Santa Ana.

10.0 APPROVAL OF MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH ORANGE COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION FOR PARAPROFESSIONAL TEACHER TRAINING PROGRAM FOR 2010-11 SCHOOL YEAR

It was moved by Mr. Reyna, seconded by Mr. Hernández, and carried 5-0, to approve the Memorandum of Understanding with Orange County Department of Education for Paraprofessional Teacher Training Program for the 2010-11 school year.

Mr. Reyna:

- Kuddos to Middle College. We have 27 students who will be graduating with an A.A. from high school. That is definitely a phenomenal job!
- He had an opportunity to go to the District "Teacher of the Year" dinner. It was absolutely fantastic to see smiling faces amongst the audience of our teachers who were being recognized for the great work they are doing in the community and with our students. There are no words to express his gratitude for all they do.
- The student who played Belle tried out for the very first time. She did not know she had hidden talent. He encouraged parents and teachers to engage and allow students to participate in something different. He said that, as adults we should guide them in different subjects, clubs, or activities.
