April 14, 2009

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 4:45 p.m. by Board President Hernández. Other members in attendance were Dr. Yamagata-Noji, Mr. Palacio, and Mr. Reyna. Mr. Richardson was not present at the meeting.

Cabinet members present were Ms. Russo, Dr. Olsky, Mr. Murrey, Mr. Lopez, Mr. Mendez, Mr. Ayala, Ms. Lohnes and Mr. Dixon.

PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS

Board President Hernández asked those wishing to address the Board in matters pertaining to Closed Session to step to the podium.

There were no speakers to address the Board regarding Closed Session items.

RECESS TO CLOSED SESSION

The Regular meeting was immediately recessed to Closed Session to consider student discipline issues, legal matters, and personnel matters.

The Regular meeting reconvened at 6:40 p.m.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Ms. Russo introduced the Santa Ana High School Student's Mariachi band led by Music Advisor Eric Vismantas. The group performed "Las Golondrinas" (The Swallows) followed by "Solamente Una Ves" (Only One Time).

Century High United Student Body President Jissel Frausto shared her role as the USB president and she provided insight on activities underway at Century High School.

SAUSD's School Police Officer Brian Harris received commendations for his valiant act that saved a Santa Ana resident's life. Officer Harris responded to a call to render aid to a man that was laying on the railroad tracks. Officer Harris quickly pulled the individual from the tracks and from an oncoming Metrolink train. Officer Harris has been a patrol officer for SAUSD since 2007 and is our informal liaison to the Orange County Gang Investigators Association. Officer Harris consistently is a top performer in the department and takes pride in his work. His parents and grandmother were present at the meeting.

Adams Elementary students and staff were on hand to receive a surprise announcement that their school was one of three in the Orange County/Los Angeles areas that would receive a complete library makeover courtesy of Target. Renovations will occur over the summer and be unveiled in October. The effort is a collaborative between Target and The Heart of America Foundation and is led by a team of local Target volunteers. In a video, Channel 31 captured the expressions of students and staff who heard the surprise announcement.

Ms. Russo announced the winners of the Food 4 Thought "Design a School Breakfast Superhero Contest," held in honor of National School Breakfast Week March 2 through 6, recently were announced. A slide presentation was shown of the winning submissions while Ms. Russo read the superhero names, creators, and grade level and schools they represented. All 1st place winners will be entered into the National competition.

The Superintendent reminded parents of Open House for Intermediate Schools on Wednesday, April 22 from 5-8 p.m. and for Elementary Schools on Thursday, April 23. Start times may vary by school. For information on times, contact the Public Information Office at (714) 558-5555.

Chavez High School will have open house on Wednesday, April 22 at 6 p.m., and Middle College High School's doors open to the public this Friday, April 17 at 5 p.m. for incoming freshmen and at 5:45 p.m. for all other students. Parents, family and community members are encouraged to attend.

Ms. Russo announced the upcoming conference which will take place on Saturday, May 2 from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. at Century High School. We will focus on the Southeast Asian community, however all parents are encouraged to take part in the many workshops, resources and information covering parenting skills, college opportunities, financial aid, drug awareness and more. The Superintendent asked those in the Board Room to draw their attention to the creative student artwork displayed from Godinez Fundamental High, Sepulveda Elementary, and Lincoln Elementary Schools.

Mr. Russo recognized Ms. Amelia Ayala for her 4-years of loyal service to the SAUSD. Ms. Ayala has accepted a position at the City of El Monte as Director of Human Resources.

PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS

President Hernández asked those members of the community who wished to address the Board to step forward as he called their names.

The following individuals addressed the Board in support of teachers, counselors, special education instructional assistants, psychologists, librarian technicians, and Class Size Reduction. They also voiced concerns about layoffs and the affects on students if positions were to be reduced.

Mr. Balcazar - SAUSD parent and consultant for the SAUSD, addressed the Board in support of continued funding for his professional health consultant business. He also spoke in support of school psychologists and outreach consultants.

Mr. Shepherd - SAUSD teacher spoke in support of the arts in the SAUSD. He also spoke about RIF notices and the May 15 deadline.

PRESENTATIONS

#1 Presentation -Special Education Stoplight Report

Ms. Russo asked that Ms. Lohnes, Assistant Superintendent, Support Services, step to the podium for the presentation of the Special Education progress report.

Ms. Lohnes introduced Principal Steve Longacre from Taft/Taft DHH School and the Parents of the Year, Mr. and Mrs. Jaurequi. Mr. Jaurequi commended the Special Education program and thanked staff involved with their child's education. Ms. Lohnes noted that the contributions that the parents have made by assisting the school and community have been countless. They have presented information in parent groups, assisted teachers in the classroom, and met with parents to help in the education of their children. They were presented with a bouquet of flowers. To focus on a successful special education program Ms. Lohnes introduced Marilyn Nehrbass and Debbie Woods, Special Education Program Specialists, who provided an outstanding presentation of the SAUSD Autistic Program and its offerings to staff and students. Ms. Lohnes stated that her staff has been recognized throughout the State because of the high level of training and information they attain. Ms. Lohnes also introduced Gail Minnich, Program Specialist for Elementary, who was in attendance and stated that she is an asset to the special education department and someone the parents could count on to get the work done. She then moved on to the Stoplight Report.

The report represented the third of four progress reports for the 2008-09 school year. Mrs. Lohnes provided a brief overview of each item that are now all on target:

- Shared responsibility for and support of Special Education students by District and school site administrators
- Web-based IEPs
- Facility improvements for students with disabilities through Measure G
- Additional services related to the needs of the increasing number of students with Autism
- Best practices in assessments
- Implementation of reading grant
- Prevention interventions prior to Special Education referral
- Serve Our Own students with SAUSD programs
- System of staff development
- Parents of Students with Disabilities: support, education, and involvement
- Fundamental schools accessibility

#2 Presentation - Construction Update

Mr. Joe Dixon, Assistant Superintendent of Facilities and Governmental Relations provided a presentation. He began by stating that school construction funds under Measure G are restricted to school facilities and could not be used on salaries or anything else. Mr. Dixon noted that all State funds remain frozen and due of the passage of the Measure G Bond, the SAUSD is able to continue construction with the Critically Overcrowded Schools (COS), Emergency Repair Program (ERP), and Modernization project funds. He then reviewed a summary of projects and commitments. He noted that the State normally sells 6-7 bonds per year and stated since June 2008, none have been sold until last month. He stated that the SAUSD is in line to receive \$25 million and the state has indicated that they would fully-fund the outstanding debt. He then identified and provided descriptions on COS projects and cost estimates totaling \$65.9 million in phases I and II. He then turned the presentation over to Mr. Jerry Hills, Construction Manager.

Mr. Hills reviewed COS cost estimates under construction at Carr, Diamond, Greenville, Kennedy, Lowell, Madison, Martin, and Santiago elementary schools and ERP projects at Saddleback High and Carr Intermediate schools. Arial photos were shown of some construction projects underway.

Mr. Dixon addressed questions from the Board and was asked that he include in the next update COS, Modernization, and ERP funds and plan, vision and projects regarding the federal stimulus, and to meet and update the various groups of all the construction projects using Measure G funds.

3 Presentation - District Budget Update

Mr. Ron Murrey, Associate Superintendent, Business Services provided an update regarding the District Budget. He reviewed information discussed at the Special Study Session of April 9, 2009, that included expenditure priorities for the 2009-10 school year, standardized staffing model and other priorities reflecting State and Federal funding scenarios. He also outlined options for Class Size Reduction (CSR) based on projected funding. He will bring information to the April 28 Board meeting as directed by the Board. He stated that the states' end of the year funding revisions will not be available until mid June due to the election of May 19. He noted that staff reduction notices are anticipated to be sent out to classified staff by May 1 and certificated staff's final notice by May 15. And that the third interim fiscal report would be presented to the Board on May 26 with the adoption for the 2009-10 budget before June 30. He then outlined a budget timeline.

Mr. Murrey stated that there was conflicting information about the Federal Stimulus Package. Mr. Montero, CEO of Fiscal Crisis & Management Assistance Team (FCMAT) was quoted as saying, "It (Federal Stimulus) will help support cash flow at the state level rather than coming to the school districts Mr. Murrey then stated that the Legislative Analyst's Office (LAO) recommends that Legislature "hold back" Federal Stimulus funds for State Budget needs (March 13, 2009). With the information received by the experts, the request for funds from Stimulus monies remain uncertain. Mr. Murrey stated that the SAUSD would continue with its budget communication plan and explain budget cuts to legislators as well as continue working with other Districts and education advocates. Actions taken include requesting immediate direct release of Federal monies, and request that legislation move the May 15 notification back to late June. Mr. Murrey will be updating the Board as he receives information at the next Board meeting.

Mr. Murrey stated that a Board resolution regarding the May election propositions may be placed on the agenda April 28th Board meeting. Additional actions to be recommended included a letter writing campaign to legislators and requests for flexibility of State Tier I and Tier II funding as well as all federal funds.

Board members made suggestions and requests, asked that the District continue taking an offensive local approach, and take the lead with legislators.

- She lauded the Sugar production performed by Valley High School students. Ms. Karen Bluel, Performing Arts teacher, accompanist Carolyn Van Hauser, Choreographer Alex O'Campo and the students did a phenomenal job!
- She asked to certain information is conveyed to the Asian Community regarding the upcoming Southeast Asian Parent Mini- Conference at Century High School on Saturday, May 2, 2009.
- She would like to have a video tape demonstration of the SmartBoard.
- She announced that Arts on the Lawn is coming in May. The Mariachi group, schools' productions, and the arts are important. She asked that staff invite influential arts supporters to be a part of the Arts on the Lawn event.

Mr. Palacio:

- He asked that we do a press release on Officer Harris on his Heroic act by pulling the individual from the railroad tracks. He noted that each year Law Enforcement honors its heroes and it is important that he have that opportunity.
- He noted that fundraising is important; such as parents who raised \$20,000 at Sierra. He believes the funds could be better used for supplemental materials. How do we fundraise without impacting our facilities. He is very grateful for their efforts!
- Contact Mr. Espinosa to follow up with his concerns.

Mr. Reyna:

- He echoed Mr. Palacio's request to contact parent Mr. Espinosa regarding his concerns.

- USB president from Century High School did a great job; she showcased her skills well. This is a great opportunity for students to share their perspective of what is going on, on their campus.

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• He stated that parents are not quite sure about the Budget. He suggested community forums at intermediate and high schools and would make himself available.

Mr. Hernández:

- With respect to Officer Harris the District is very fortunate to have an officer like him. He has asked that when individuals are recognized that their families come up with them to the podium.
- He stated that fundraising is important, but also be cautious of the ability of some families.
- He and Mr. Reyna went to the First Annual Armstrong Foundation Golf Tournament. It was fun! And over \$7,000 was collected which will go toward athletic programs in the SAUSD.
- Visited a couple of schools for Back to School Night and noted that our schools are doing great work.
- In reference to the Budget, we said that we must get the word out. As we implement a plan to consider fundraising.

Campus Security

The Governing Board is committed to providing a school environment that promotes the safety of students, employees, and visitors to school grounds. The Board also recognizes the importance of protecting district property, facilities, and equipment from vandalism and theft.

The Superintendent or designee shall develop campus security procedures which are consistent with the goal and objectives of the district's comprehensive safety plan and site-level safety plans. Such procedures shall be regularly reviewed to reflect changed circumstances and to assess their effectiveness in achieving safe school objectives.

Surveillance Systems

The Board believes that reasonable use of surveillance cameras will help the district achieve its goals for campus security. In consultation with the safety planning committee and relevant staff, the Superintendent or designee shall identify appropriate locations for the placement of surveillance cameras. Cameras shall not be placed in areas where students, staff, or community members have reasonable expectation of privacy. Any audio capability on the district's surveillance equipment shall be disabled so that sounds are not recorded.

With the exception of convert cameras that have been temporarily installed for criminal investigation, prior to the operation of the surveillance system, the Superintendent or designee shall ensure that signs are posted at conspicuous locations at affected school buildings and grounds. These signs shall inform students, staff, and visitors that surveillance may occur and shall state whether the district's system is actively monitored by school personnel. The Superintendent or designee shall also provide prior written notice to students and parents/guardians about the district's surveillance system, including the locations where surveillance may occur, explaining that the recordings may be used in disciplinary proceedings, and that matters captured by the camera may be referred to local law enforcement, as appropriate.

To the extent that any images from the district's surveillance system create a student or personnel record, the Superintendent or designee shall ensure that the images are accessed, retained, and disclosed in accordance with law, Board policy, administrative regulation, and any applicable collective bargaining agreements.

Close Circuit Television and Surveillance System

The Governing Board is committed to providing a school environment that promotes the safety of students, employees, and visitors to school grounds. The Board also recognizes the importance of protecting district property, facilities, and equipment from vandalism and theft.

The Superintendent or designee shall develop campus security procedures which are consistent with the goals and objectives of the district's comprehensive safety plan and site-level safety plans. Such procedures shall be regularly reviewed to reflect changed circumstances and to assess their effectiveness in achieving safe school objectives.

Use of Surveillance Systems

Use of surveillance systems and the use of cameras must be reasonable and the cameras must not be used in areas where there is a "reasonable expectation of privacy." Thus, cameras will not be located in areas such as bathrooms, locker rooms, or private offices. Education Code 51512 prohibits the use of a recording device in a classroom. Examples of locations where cameras may generally be used include hallways, stairwells, parking lots, and cafeterias.

Cost-Benefit Analysis

Before adopting the use of such a system, a cost-benefit analysis should be conducted to determine whether surveillance cameras are the most effective method to address the particular security concerns on the campus or support sites. Another determination is whether the cameras will be monitored in "real time" by trained personnel or whether the images will be recorded and later used as "evidence." The district will also determine whether the system will record images 24 hours a day, during school hours, or on some other schedule. Because audio surveillance generally requires a warrant, if the district's equipment has audio capability, it should be disabled so that sounds are not recorded.

Appropriate Locations

The Board believes that reasonable use of surveillance cameras will help the district achieve its goals for campus security. In consultation with the safety planning committee and relevant staff, the Superintendent or designee shall identify appropriate locations for the placement of surveillance cameras. Cameras shall not be placed in areas where students, staff, or community members have a reasonable expectation of privacy. Any audio capability on the district's surveillance equipment shall be disabled so that sounds are not recorded.

Signage

Signage can serve as a deterrent against vandals. District will post signs that state whether or not the system is being actively monitored so that potential victims are not under the impression that a person is watching events live and will be able to provide immediate assistance. The District will provide notice to students and parents/guardians about the district's surveillance program in order to clarify that there is no expectation of privacy in those locations where the cameras will be placed and that images from the cameras may be used in disciplinary proceedings.

Prior to the operation of the surveillance system, the Superintendent or designee shall ensure that signs are posted at conspicuous locations at affected school buildings and grounds. These signs shall inform students, staff, and visitors that surveillance may occur and shall state whether the district's system is actively monitored by school personnel. The Superintendent or designee shall also provide prior written notice to students and parents/guardians about the district's surveillance system, including the locations where surveillance may occur, explaining that the recordings may be used in disciplinary proceedings, and that matters captured by the camera may be referred to local law enforcement, as appropriate.

Suspension and Expulsion/Due Process

Any recording or image of a student collected by the district is considered a "student record" and thus is subject to those laws regarding access, disclosure, and retention. In addition, a recording or image of a staff member that may be used in a personnel action is subject to the laws regarding personnel records, including an employee's right to comment on derogatory information placed in his/her file. To the extent that any images from the district's surveillance system create a student or personnel record, the Superintendent or designee shall ensure that the images are accessed, retained, and disclosed in accordance with law, Board policy, administrative regulation, and any applicable laws.
