REGULAR MEETING  
SANTA ANA BOARD OF EDUCATION

November 23, 2010

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 5:10 p.m. by Board President Yamagata-Noji. Other members in attendance were Mr. Richardson, Mr. Hernández, Mr. Palacio, and Mr. Reyna.

Cabinet members present were Ms. Russo, Dr. Olsky, Mr. Lopez, Mr. Bishop, Mr. Mendez, Ms. Miller, Ms. Lohnes, and Mr. Dixon.

RECESS TO CLOSED SESSION

The Regular meeting recessed to Closed Session to consider student discipline issues, negotiations, public employee discipline/dismissal, confidential issues, legal matters, and personnel matters.

CLOSED SESSION PRESENTATIONS

Board President Yamagata-Noji asked those wishing to address the Board in matters pertaining to Closed Session to step to the podium.

There were no individuals wishing to address the Board.

RECONVENE OPEN MEETING

The Regular meeting reconvened at 6:40 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Erika Fuentes, ASB President Saddleback High School.

SUPERINTENDENT'S COMMENTS

Superintendent Russo announced that after 40 years there is a new YMCA open in Santa Ana, thanks to the partnership among the YMCA, Santa Ana Unified School District, the Segerstrom family, and the Children and Families Commission of Orange County. The center is adjacent to Segerstrom High School. The facility offers a speed soccer arena and a joint-use state-of-the-art aquatic center for the area's children and families. Channel 31 showed a brief video of the recent grand opening celebration.

On Saturday, October 30, a "Flip the Switch" ceremony was held signifying Saddleback High Schools' new solar energy system -the largest operating solar generating system currently in Orange County. A host of school staff, students, community members and partners, vendors, dignitaries, and elected officials celebrated in the momentous occasion. The event included a Community Fair and Environmental Expo, and offered free electronics recycling to the public. A clip was shown of what recently aired on KOCE TV.

Saddleback ASB President

Erika Fuentes, Saddleback High's Associated Student Body President shared what it's like to be a student at the newly transformed Saddleback High School, a College Major School. She said that there is a new attitude at Valley and all students seem to be engaged in learning. Additionally, students love the shade that the solar panels have brought to the school as well as the 75% savings of the facilities electricity demands.

Ms. Russo asked to the podium, Valley High School's Athletic Director Terri Orabona and junior Michelle Martinez. Michelle earned the school's first ever Orange League Golf Individual Championship. She began playing golf as a sophomore and made first team all league as a novice. Not only did Michelle win the individual championship this year, she is League MVP for 2010-11. Michelle has nearly a 4.0 GPA and also plays soccer and competes in track. Michelle shared her love for the sport and encouraged others to get involved in golf.

Harvey Elementary is both a 2010 California Distinguished School and a 2009-10 Title One Academic Achieving School. This year the school boosted its California State Academic Performance Index from 801 to an impressive 828 - a record high! We look forward to celebrating the success of the students and staff.

Rebeca was enrolled in College Preparatory classes and Dance. She attended 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade at Lathrop Intermediate School prior to attending Saddleback High.

Steve Gomez was an outgoing sophomore who very much enjoyed drawing. He attended Carver, Romero Cruz Elementary, and Mendez Fundamental Intermediate School prior to attending Godinez Fundamental High.

A moment of silence was observed in honor of Steve Gomez and Rebeca Andaya.

## RECOGNITION

Classified Employee of the Month for November 2010- Julio Nuñez

The District Classified Selection Committee nominated Mr. Julio Nuñez, as the Classified Employee of the Month for November. Julio has been employed by the SAUSD for over twenty years with assignments at Glenn Martin, Franklin Elementary Schools, and currently at Saddleback High as a Library Media Technician. ## PRESENTATIONS

2010-11 Quarterly Report and 2009-10 Annual Report for Williams Settlement Legislation

Dr. Olsky, Deputy Superintendent presented two reports which are both requirements pursuant to the Williams Settlement Legislation. Mr. Dixon clarified the complaints and remediation process on the annual report.

#1 First Quarterly Report

In order to meet the Williams Settlement Uniform Complaint Reporting requirements, staff is required to report summarized data on the nature and resolution of all complaints on a quarterly basis to the County Superintendent of Schools and Governing Board of school districts.

There were no complaints reported during the first quarter from September 21, 2010 through November 23, 2010.

#2 2009-10 School Year - Annual Report

There were 37 schools evaluated, and 158 deficiencies reported. Custodial staff remediated all deficiencies. Custodial staffs were trained on the use of Facility Inspection Tool (FIT) used for Williams' inspections.

Other reports such as instructional materials, accountability reports, CAHSEE intensive instruction and services programs and teacher assignments were found to be compliant during the 2009-10 school year.

2010-11 Budget Update

Mr. Bishop presented a budget update. He stated that there were State funding changes that added \$13.8 million to SAUSD. He noted changes in Federal funding such as one-time funds: Jobs Bill for an award amount for SAUSD of \$10.3 million (\$9.2 million already received) and ARRA Stabilization with a projected amount of \$2 million.

On November 11, the outgoing Governor called a special session for the new legislature starting December 6, 2010 to address the LAO estimated budget shortfalls of \$6.1 billion in 2010-11 and \$19.3 billion in 2011-12.

School Services of California has expressed concern regarding the budget and advises districts to include additional revenues for budget purposes, but to refrain from spending any funds until the January 2011 Governor's proposal, or better yet, the 2011 May Revise before any spending.

The Orange County Department of Education (OCDE) has advised Districts to align their budget to the current State adopted budget utilizing the State adopted budget assumptions, preliminarily projected budget reductions will be adjusted as follows for the first interim to eliminate deficit:

May Revise - \$31.5 million for 2011-12 and for 2012-13 \$30.5 million

State adopted budget - \$18 million for 2011-12 and for 2012-13 \$24 million

Mr. Bishop stated that OCDE requires Districts to identify ongoing budget reductions for 2011-12 by the second-interim budget (March 2011).

The OCDE has issued guidance that require districts to revise budgets to the current State adopted budget. The OCDE will require districts to identify ongoing budget reductions for 2011-12 by the 2<sup>nd</sup> interim Budget on March 8, 2011.

Mr. Bishop stated that Senate Pro Tem and incoming Governor are hinting at mid-year cuts. And Mr. Bishop reminded the Board that more than 25% of 2010-11 District Revenue is deferred into 2011-12 and there is less than six-months remaining in the school year. Next school year, ARRA and Jobs Bill funding ends, budget, Health and Welfare costs projected to increase by double-digit percentages, apportionment deferrals continue impacting cash flow and the State Budget deficit now at \$19.3 billion. He stated that he would bring the bring the First Interim Report and the 2009-10 Annual Audit reports to the Board on December 14<sup>th</sup>. And that there may be a need to hold special Board meetings in January and February on proposed budget reductions.

#### PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS

Board President Yamagata-Noji asked those wishing to address the Board in matters pertaining to items on the Agenda to step to the podium.

Miguel Gama, SAUSD resident, addressed the Board regarding Saddleback, McFadden, and Monroe regarding inappropriate behavior of students, the dress code, and traffic issues.

Venancio Chavez, SAUSD resident, addressed the Board regarding education in general and made suggestions to academic success for Santa Ana students.

### **2.0 APPROVAL OF ORACLE LEARNING MANAGEMENT SOFTWARE PROGRAM**

This software program has a module specific to the District's Human Resources System that will allow for more efficient tracking and documentation of employees' professional development, mandated trainings, certifications, credentialing, and legal requirements. Additionally, it will integrate with three software programs and put it all into the Oracle Learning Management system.

### **4.0 APPROVAL OF MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN SANTA ANA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT AND *BIG SMILES***

It was moved by Mr. Palacio, seconded by Dr. Yamagata-Noji, and carried 5-0, to approve the Memorandum of Understanding with *BIG SMILES*.

### **5.0 APPROVAL OF AMENDMENT TO FACILITIES AGREEMENT BETWEEN SANTA ANA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT AND EL SOL SCIENCE AND ARTS ACADEMY CHARTER SCHOOL**

This item was presented to the Board for an extension of 30 days for discussions and negotiations between parties in order to draft a feasible charter facilities use agreement; however, additional time is required to allow for review and approval of the proposed document by the charter school governing board. Mr. Palacio made a motion to amend the extension to 90 days.

It was moved by Mr. Palacio, seconded by Dr. Yamagata-Noji, and carried 5-0, to amend and extend the term of the original agreement from 30 days to 90 days. All other terms and conditions of the agreement will remain in effect. The agreement will return to the SAUSD Board for action in February 2011.
