Board Presentation/Public Hearings/Approvals

- American Civil Liberties Union Settlement on Student Fees
 Business Services Associate Superintendent Michael Bishop presented an overview to the Board
 describing the ACLU lawsuit against the State of California and settlement with several school
 districts regarding student fees. <u>View presentation</u>.
- Public Hearing held to Change the name of Sierra Intermediate School to Sierra Preparatory Academy (Agenda Item 3.0) The Board approved the request of students and staff to change the name of Sierra Intermediate to Sierra Preparatory Academy in keeping with its transformation of adopting a new culture and academic focus.
- Public Hearing Conducted for Assembly Bill 602 Annual Budget and Service Plans for School Year 2010-11 (Agenda Item 4.0) Assembly Bill 602, Chapter 654, Statues of 1997, added requirements to special education local plans in the areas of SELPA governance and public participation requiring SELPAs to submit an Annual Budget and an Annual Service Plan to the California Department of Education. Both plans need to be adopted at a public hearing by the governing board of each SELPA. Per Education Code (Section 56205) SELPA plans are required to identify expenditures for services, and demonstrate that individuals with disabilities have appropriate services and access to instruction.
- Approval of Schoolwide Single Plans for Student Achievement for 2010-11 School Year. (Agenda Item 6.0) As required by State and Federal regulations, schools which participate in the Consolidated Application Categorical Aid Programs must annually update their school goals, objectives and budgets to maximize educational services and academic progress. The single site plans for student achievement are developed collaboratively with input from the school site council, instructional staff, parents, administrators and students.
