### BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The purpose of this agenda item is to approve the first amendment to the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the City of Santa Ana and Santa Ana Unified School District (SAUSD) regarding SAUSD Chief of School Police Services.

### **RATIONALE:**

At the February 24, 2009 Board meeting, the Board approved a Memorandum of Understanding for a City of Santa Ana Police Lieutenant to act as the District's Chief of School Police Services for a term of 12 months. 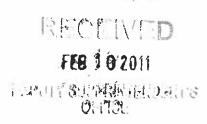
