### BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The purpose of this agenda item is to seek Board approval of the Oracle Learning Management software program for the Human Resources Department.

### RATIONALE:

The Suite of Oracle products has a module specific to the District's Human Resources system that will allow for more efficient tracking and documentation of employees' professional development, mandated trainings, certifications, credentialing, and legal requirements. Oracle Learning Management will integrate the Human Resources module with information from other District departments including: Educational Services, Educational Technology, Special Education, Risk Management, and school sites. This program will take the information which is currently collected with three software programs and put it all into the Oracle Learning Management system.

Currently, employee professional development sign-up, attendance, and verification is managed through Go Sign Me Up for certificated staff and Excel for classified staff. Mandated trainings and legal requirements are tracked using an online system. Certifications and credentialing are provided to the District using the Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CTC) database OCDE's human resource system. Oracle Learning Management will bring all of these independent sources of information into one system that connects the information directly to each employee. One of the greatest benefits is this system will automatically notify the employee, the supervisor, and Human Resources when the employee needs to update, renew, or become recertified and ensure that the employee and ultimately the District are meeting federal, state, and local mandates.

Oracle Learning Management has an initial cost of \$125,086.50 and first year maintenance of \$15,956.20, which will be funded out of Microsoft Education Technology K-12 Voucher Program and the ongoing annual cost of \$15,956.20 which will be funded using Title II funds. The Education Technology K-12 Voucher Program, which resulted from the Antitrust Settlement Agreement between California consumers and Microsoft Corporation, provides reimbursements to the district for specifically defined technology purchases until 2012. The District spends over \$5,000 to operate the current systems and both the initial and ongoing expenses will have no impact upon the District's general funds.
