BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The purpose of this agenda item is to seek Board approval of this Memorandum of Understanding with BIG SMILES. Since 1997, BIG SMILES has worked with local dentists to provide on-site dental care at schools, and staff is proposing to formalize these services through a memorandum of understanding.

RATIONALE:

This memorandum of understanding will provide an agreement between the Santa Ana Unified School District and the BIG SMILES (Coordinated by Dr. Elliot Schlang, DDS, PC) to provide on-site dental care at schools at various mutually agreed school sites. The District is responsible for providing a school space where dental services will be rendered to students upon written consent from their parents.

BIG SMILES has agreed that services will be rendered to any student of the Santa Ana Unified School District regardless of insurance, lack of insurance, or their eligibility for any county or state program.

BIG SMILES would provide on-site dental care to various schools and will also provide students with return appointments as needed. Each dental patient will be provided with a written report to take home. In addition, parents shall be provided with a toll free number to contact BIG SMILES regarding any questions they may have.

Services include:

- Dental screening, x-rays and development of a treatment plan
- Cleaning, fluoridation and sealants as needed
- Oral health education
- Fillings, non-surgical extractions, pulp treatments and crown if necessary
- Case management for outside referrals for additional care
- Re-appointment for follow up and/or 6 month check-up at school
- After obtaining written parental consent for the initial examination and cleaning, should it become apparent that the student requires an extraction or root canal, BIG SMILES will obtain additional consent from the parent/guardian before performing these or similarly invasive procedures.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN BIG SMILES (COORDINATED BY DR. ELLIOT SCHLANG, DDS, PC) & SANTA ANA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT (DISTRICT)

1. A dentist licensed by the state and in good standing with the Board of Dental Examiners, will provide dental care for the students whose parent or guardian authorizes this dental service in the District. All staff will comply with required background check and fingerprinting protocols.
2. BIG SMILES will obtain approval from parents or guardian for the child to see the dentist at District and shall receive and document approval prior to providing any dental services. Said documentation will be made available to the District upon request.
3. District staff shall distribute and collect consent forms from students once or twice per year. Consent forms shall be provided by BIG SMILES.
4. BIG SMILES shall contact school designees to schedule clinic dates and provide a list of students to be seen. BIG SMILES will coordinate with school building level officials regarding acceptable dates for dental team to be on site.
5. A dental support team of dental assistant and an x-ray teacher/technician with advanced mobile dental equipment, such as digital x-ray equipment, will be brought to District to assist the dentist in developing treatment plans and providing care.
6. Children will be taught about the importance of oral hygiene, proper brushing and flossing techniques and the dangers of smoking to their oral health.
7. There will be no costs to the District due to the administration of this program.
8. Prior to the commencement of services, BIG SMILES shall agree to submit to DISTRICT evidence of comprehensive general liability insurance coverage with a minimum limit of \$1,000,000 per occurrence, combined single limits, and worker's compensation insurance coverage in accordance with the State of CA statutory limits. Evidence of insurance for will be provided on an annual basis.
9. BIG SMILES also agrees to hold harmless, to defend, and indemnify DISTRICT, its governing board, the individual members thereof, and all district officers, agents and employees from any loss, damage, liability, cost or expenses that may arise as a result of activity by an employee, agent or officer of the signatory agency during or as a result of the activities here to agreed upon being performed. The District assumes no responsibility whatsoever for any property placed on the premises.
10. Each dental patient will be provided with a written report to take home. In addition, parents shall be provided with a toll free number to contact BIG SMILES regarding any questions they have.
11. Program will adhere to all applicable laws, Dental Board regulations, and policies, including but not limited to HIPAA and a copy of program's HIPAA notification form shall be made available to DISTRICT upon request. In addition, this HIPAA notification is provided to all parents along with the consent form.
12. The names of dentists and other staff who will serve the children of the District and copies of relevant diplomas, certification and or license will be provided upon request to District.
13. This agreement is for an indefinite term and is cancelable by either party upon written or verbal receipt of notification to cancel with 90 days notice.
14. After obtaining written parental consent for the initial examination and cleaning, should it become apparent that the student requires an extraction or root canal, Big Smiles will obtain additional consent from the parent/guardian before performing these or similarly invasive procedures.
15. Each time a dental team visits a school, 1 uninsured child on average will receive a donated appointment. The school nurse may either select the student or request the student be selected at random by BIG SMILES.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The purpose of this agenda item is to seek Board approval to amend the Facilities Agreement between SAUSD and El Sol Science and Arts Academy Charter School.

El Sol Science and Arts Academy of Santa Ana and the Santa Ana Unified School District entered into a Charter Facilities Use Agreement dated June 26, 2007, whereby the District allows use of the District's property located at 1010 N. Broadway in Santa Ana by El Sol for the operation of the El Sol Science and Arts Academy of Santa Ana. The term of the original agreement expired on June 30, 2010. However, the Santa Ana Unified School District Board previously approved amendments to extend the term of the original agreement for an additional thirty (30) days on June 22, 2010, on September 28, 2010 and October 26, 2010, respectively. The amendment to extend the Agreement approved on October 26, 2010 expires November 30, 2010. All other terms and conditions of the Agreement have remained in effect.

Discussions and negotiations between the parties has resulted in the drafting of a feasible Charter Facilities Use Agreement. However, additional time is required to allow for review and approval of the proposed document by the charter school governing board. To facilitate the process, approval by the Santa Ana Unified School District Board of a fourth amendment to extend the term of the original Agreement an additional thirty (30) days is being sought at this time. All other terms and conditions of the Agreement will remain in effect.

RATIONALE:

Pursuant to Section 18 of the current charter facilities use agreement, the agreement may be amended by a written instrument executed by both parties. An amendment to the charter facilities use agreement by and between the parties has been drafted and fully executed by the charter school.

**AMENDMENT TO CHARTER FACILITIES AGREEMENT
BY AND BETWEEN
SANTA ANA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT AND
EL SOL SCIENCE AND ARTS ACADEMY OF SANTA ANA**

THIS AMENDMENT ("Amendment") to the Charter Facilities Agreement dated June 26, 2007 by and between Santa Ana Unified School District and El Sol Science and Arts Academy of Santa Ana is made this 23rd day of November, 2010 (the "Effective Date"), by and between Santa Ana Unified School District, a public school district organized and existing under the laws of the State of California ("District") and El Sol Science and Arts Academy of Santa Ana, a California non-profit public benefit corporation incorporated for purposes of operating El Sol Science and Arts Academy, a California public charter school ("Charter School"). The District and Charter School are collectively referred to as "the parties."

RECITALS

WHEREAS, El Sol Science and Arts Academy of Santa Ana ("El Sol") and the Santa Ana Unified School District ("District") entered into a Charter Facilities Use Agreement ("Agreement") dated June 26, 2007, whereby the District allows use of the District's property located at 1010 N. Broadway in Santa Ana ("property") by El Sol for the operation of the El Sol Science and Arts Academy of Santa Ana;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 1 of the Agreement, the Charter School's right to exclusive use of the Subject Property shall conclude at the expiration of this Agreement on June 30, 2010;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 18 of the Agreement, this Agreement, together with its attachments, constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior discussions, negotiations and agreements, whether oral or written and may be amended or modified only by a written instrument executed by the Parties;

WHEREAS, at the June 22, 2010, meeting of the Santa Ana Unified School District Board of Education, an amendment extending the original charter facilities use agreement between the parties for ninety (90) days until September 28, 2010, was approved. All other terms and conditions of the Agreement remained in effect;

WHEREAS, during the ninety (90) day extension of the term of the Agreement, the Parties did engage in negotiation of, in good faith, a long term lease between the Parties for the Charter School's use of the property;

WHEREAS, at the expiration of the ninety (90) day extension of the original charter facilities use agreement on September 30, 2010, the parties desired to amend the agreement to extend the term for an additional thirty (30) days until October 31, 2010, to facilitate continued negotiation of, in good faith, a long term lease between the Parties for the Charter School's use of the property;

WHEREAS, at the September 28, 2010, meeting of the Santa Ana Unified School District Board of Education, an amendment extending the original Charter Facilities Use Agreement between the parties for an additional thirty (30) days was approved. All other terms and conditions of the Agreement remained in effect;

WHEREAS, discussions and negotiations between the parties has resulted in the drafting of a feasible Charter Facilities Use Agreement, additional time is still required to allow for the completion of review and approval of the document by the charter school governing board;

WHEREAS, to facilitate the completion of review and approval of the proposed facilities use agreement by the charter school governing board and to accommodate, if necessary, further discussion and negotiation, an amendment to further extend the term of the original charter facilities use agreement until November 31, 2010, was approved by the Santa Ana Unified School District Board on October 26, 2010.

WHEREAS, the development and refinement of several points of the proposed agreement was accomplished during the extension most recently approved by the Santa Ana Unified School District Board, the document is still pending finalization prior to submission to the Santa Ana Unified School District Board for consideration of approval. Therefore, approval of an additional thirty (30) day extension to complete the remaining outstanding processes is being requested at this time.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth, the Parties agree as follows:

Amendment 4. Fourth Extension of Term of Charter Facilities Agreement by and between Santa Ana Unified School District and El Sol Science and Arts Academy of Santa Ana.

At the June 22, 2010, meeting of the Santa Ana Unified School District Board of Education, an amendment extending the original charter facilities use agreement between the parties for an additional ninety (90) days until September 28, 2010, was approved. The Charter School's right to exclusive use of the Subject Property was extended for an additional ninety (90) days which concluded on September 28, 2010.

All other terms and conditions of the Agreement remained in effect.

Subsequent to the expiration of the first extension of the Charter Facilities Use Agreement, the Santa Ana Unified School District Board approved amendments to extend the

term of the original agreement for an additional thirty (30) days on June 22, 2010, on September 28, 2010, and on October 26, 2010, respectively.

The amendment to extend the Charter Facilities Use Agreement for an additional thirty (30) days approved on October 26, 2010, expires November 30, 2010.

All other terms and conditions of the Agreement have remained in effect.

Although discussions and negotiations between the parties has resulted in the drafting of a feasible facilities use agreement and the subsequent development and refinement of several points of the proposed agreement has been accomplished, the document is still pending finalization.

To facilitate the completion of the remaining processes required to finalize the agreement, approval by the Santa Ana Unified School District Board of a fourth amendment to extend the term of the original Facilities Use Agreement an additional thirty (30) days, from December 1, 2010 through and until December 31, 2010, is required and is being sought at this time.

All other terms and conditions of the Agreement will remain in effect.

During the additional thirty (30) day extension of the term of the Agreement, the Parties intend to complete negotiation, in good faith, of a long term lease between the Parties for the Charter School's use of the Property.

All other terms and conditions of the Agreement will remain in effect.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The purpose of this agenda item is to seek Board authorization to obtain Request for Proposals for workers' compensation claims audit and health benefits enrollment/billing audit.

RATIONALE:

Staff is requesting authorization to obtain Request for Proposals for internal District audits.

The District would like to have an internal audit conducted of our workers' compensation claims to include claims handling analysis, staffing/caseloads, case reserves, quality of investigations, expense control, cost containment, payments, settlements, litigation management, documentation, diary, case closure, excess reporting and supervision. As we begin our second year with excess workers' compensation insurance, an internal claim audit has been requested by the District's excess workers' compensation carrier. The District is also anticipating a formal audit from the State of California in 2011, as required every four years, and would like an internal audit to prepare.

The District also requests an internal audit of the District's health benefits provider billings for medical, dental and vision plans. The audit would concentrate on employee and retiree enrollment compared to actual bills paid, to include District procedures.

These audits would be performed by two separate firms with the respective expertise.

Fund 67 - Self Insurance Fund: Estimated \$10,000 each audit

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The purpose of this agenda item is to seek Board approval to participate with the Orange County Department of Education and Girls, Inc. in the submission of a Community Challenge Grant involving services to Santa Ana High School (SAHS). The grant is a two-pronged approach toward lessening gang activity and reduction of teen pregnancy. The geographical area surrounding SAHS has a high degree of teenage pregnancy, making SAHS eligible for participation as a grant recipient.

For the purposes of this proposal, the Orange County Department of Education and Girls, Inc. will serve as the fiscal agent and be the responsible parties for day-to-day grant coordination, reporting, and evaluation. This proposal will use a three-pronged approach toward gang prevention and reducing teen pregnancies including comprehensive health education, body image and self-esteem building, as well as communication, conflict resolution, and team work skills.

RATIONALE:

The goals of the grant are to: 1) increase the number of community resources working with Santa Ana Unified School District; 2) provide intervention services for students through sports and after school programs; the athletic program at SAHS would receive a stipend for its coordinating services; and 3) maximize information sharing with the District. SAHS would receive the services of a 1.5 full time equivalent staff member to develop, coordinate, and provide these services.

This grant will also support the coordination and formalization of a partnership between the District and community resources, including high quality speakers, support services, and free resources for students. This Community Challenge Grant will assist in mobilizing community resources, streamlining service delivery, and leveraging multiple funding sources to maximize the community's impact on gang activities, teen pregnancy prevention, risky behavior intervention, and self-efficacy building.

FUNDING:

This grant will award \$225,000 each year for a five year period to the Orange County Department of Education and Girls, Inc. for services to Santa Ana Unified School District youth.

RECOMMENDATION:

Approve the Community Challenge Grant through a partnership with Orange County Department of Education and Girls, Inc. for 2010-15 school years.

- Interests in real estate (real property)
- Sources of personal income, including gifts, loans and travel payments
- Positions of management or employment with business entities
