

Success Criteria. This will help our teachers as they are creating slides and giving our students with formative assessments. All teachers will soon have the opportunity to participate in 1 minute PD + videos. These provide

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teachers a one-minute preview of PD, giving them the option to delve deeper if the PD applies to them. I believe that the professional development we are committing ourselves to will create a positive longterm result for our students.



Our Dashboard gives teachers more information on their students and their behavior outside of their classrooms. This tool helps us as administrators to see the frequency of the minor issues so that we have more insight into the situation when speaking with parents as necessary. Our Restorative Practices

Specialist, Jacquie Johnson and our Counselors are constantly being updated on our students and have been intervening right away. Admin can also see ODRs immediately and address them in a timely manner. Our supervisors have pictures of students who have permission to be out of class which helps them as well. Additionally, accommodations should also be on the Dashboard. Please read and acknowledge these. I believe the Dashboard will make a big difference in our students' behavior, making it easier for everyone to stay on the same page.

Lastly, I would like to reflect on the lunch area procedures. I believe they are going well with the sixth graders at assigned tables. Our students are taking more responsibility. Our staff has also taken on a lot of responsibility for our students and their futures.
