School: **Remington Elementary School**

- 1) What is your site doing *differently* this year from last year to improve student achievement?
  - Increased in-class intervention for students performing below grade level
  - Fully implementing New Common Core State Standards
  - ELD: group students by ELD levels; grades K-2 ELD instruction focused on Listening and Speaking; grades 3-5 ELD instruction focused on Reading and Writing
  - Utilize MAP benchmark data to plan interventions and differentiate instruction
  - Utilize one-time funds to purchase devices to increase student access to technology
  - Implementation of Reading Is Fundamental Program
  - Provide additional instructional support utilizing 60 hours voluntary extra duty support
  
- 2) What is your site doing this year that is considered *new* to improve student achievement?
  - Technology: new chrome books for students in grade 5 to increase access to technology
  - Provide computer classes for parents afterschool
  - Extend library hours to provide access to students and parents
  - Differentiate instruction using tools such as Learning Continuum to address student needs
  - Provide parent awareness of MAP test results
  
- 3) What is your site doing *more of* this year to improve student achievement?
  - Increase professional development on Common Core implementation
  - Increase professional development on analyzing student data
  - Increase parenting workshops to include: Padres Unidos and Raising Highly Effective Kids
  - More grade level based data analysis using Extended Response, MAP Benchmark data
  - More imbedding of technology into instruction and increase student access to technology
  
- 4) What is your site doing *less of* this year to improve student achievement?
  - Less classroom interruption
  - Less pullout for requested trainings that can be attended during non-instructional time
  - Less surface instruction: more rigorous and depth instruction
  - Less individual based student work, more Common Core/group-based projects
  - Less demands placed on teachers to allow for optimum focus on instruction
  
- 5) What is your site doing this year that is *innovative* to improve student achievement?
  - Providing voluntary after school tutoring
  - Implementation of Chrome Books Initiative in 5<sup>th</sup> grade classrooms
  - Computer technology training for parents
  - Increase computer lab/library hours before/after school
