LATHROP STUDENT UNIFORM AND DRESS CODE POLICY

All students are required to adhere to the Student Uniform/Dress Code Policy daily. Students' clothing and personal hygiene must not cause a distraction to school activities, create a hazard to the safety of others, and/or invade the rights of others. At no time, may students alter the intended wear of their clothing.

Shirts	 Collared shirts may be the following colors: Dark blue, gray, white, dark green, black, burgundy Shirts must be solid color. Spirit shirts may be worn High school shirts may be worn College shirts may be worn The expectation is that Spartan Scholars will not wear plain T shirts or pro-sports logos.
Pants	 Pants, shorts and skirts may be the following colors: Dark blue, khaki, black (Grey is not allowed) Pants should be worn at the waist (NO "sagging") The expectation is that Spartan Scholars will NOT wear ripped pants or shorts, athletic shorts, PJ bottoms, sweatpants (Pro Club), tights (except under skirts) or blue jeans.
Shorts	Shorts and skirts must touch the bottom of your longest finger when your arm is fully extended and may NOT be cut-offs. There must be a sewn hem in all shorts, skirts and pants.
Jackets/ Sweatshirts	The expectation is that Spartan Scholars may wear sweatshirts of any color, but they must not be offensive. Hoods must be kept down except during rainy days. Lathrop Intermediate apparel is always acceptable.
Belts	Belt buckles must be free of any initials or inappropriate insignias. Belts must be looped in properly (NO hanging belts)
Shoes	For safety, good athletic shoes are recommended. Shoes must be closed toe. No slippers, slipper boots, platform shoes, moccasins or sandals.
Piercings / Plugs	For safety reasons spiked earrings may not be worn and hoops may NOT be larger than a quarter. Additionally, any piercings considered unsafe or distracting by the administration are not allowed.
Hair and Makeup	Hair styles must not be distracting. Hair must not be shorter than a "2" Blade. Light makeup is permitted but must not be distracting. Makeup must be applied at home; it should not be on campus.

*When the school allows a "FREE DRESS" day, students must still adhere to the FREE DRESS Guidelines:

- Clothing must be free from tears, rips, holes, etc.
- Clothing should not be oversized or form fitting.
- Pants must fit, cannot be oversized, and must be hemmed.
- Socks will not be pulled up to meet bottom of shorts.
- There should be no visible initials, insignias, pictures, or logos on clothing, except for school logos.
- Shoes must be worn at all times and must be closed toe with a heel strap.
- Bandanas, hairnets, black gloves, and beanies are not permitted. Only those students, with the approval from the principal because of medical/religious purposes, may have an exception.
- No baseball caps other than school issued ones will be permitted. Hats must be plain with no writing. Hats are not to be worn indoors.
- Visible jewelry is limited to small watches, rings, necklaces, and bracelets; earrings should be a small stud or a hoop no larger than a dime. Wallet chains, and/or spiked and sharp jewelry are not allowed.
- Gang slogans and graffiti will not be allowed on backpacks or purses.
- No shirts with gang, drug, graffiti or sexual connotations including OC or SA in old English lettering.
- Jerseys or shirts with team logos are not allowed.
- No belt buckles with logos or initials (including anything related to weapons, drugs, or of a sexual nature) are allowed.
- No plain white T-shirts or tank tops.
- No pajamas or flannel pants.

Failure to follow the free dress guidelines may result in a loss of privilege, detention, and/or suspension.
