Description:

This course is intended to be a college preparatory, laboratory science course. However, all students are welcome regardless of academic path. It will provide credit toward the science graduation requirement.

Textbook:

Essentials of Human Anatomy and Physiology, by Martini. The books are an essential part of this class. TAKE CARE OF YOUR BOOK!

Topics covered:

- 1st semester: anatomical terms and directions, tissues, integumentary system, skeletal system, muscular system, and nervous system.
- 2nd semester: special senses, heart and blood vessels, blood, digestive system, nutrition, urinary system, reproductive system, and fetal pig dissection.

LABS

Students will perform safe lab techniques while in the lab area. All students must sign the safety contract before participating in any labs. I will remove anyone in the lab who is unsafe and they will receive a **zero** on the assignment. They also may be removed from all further labs.
