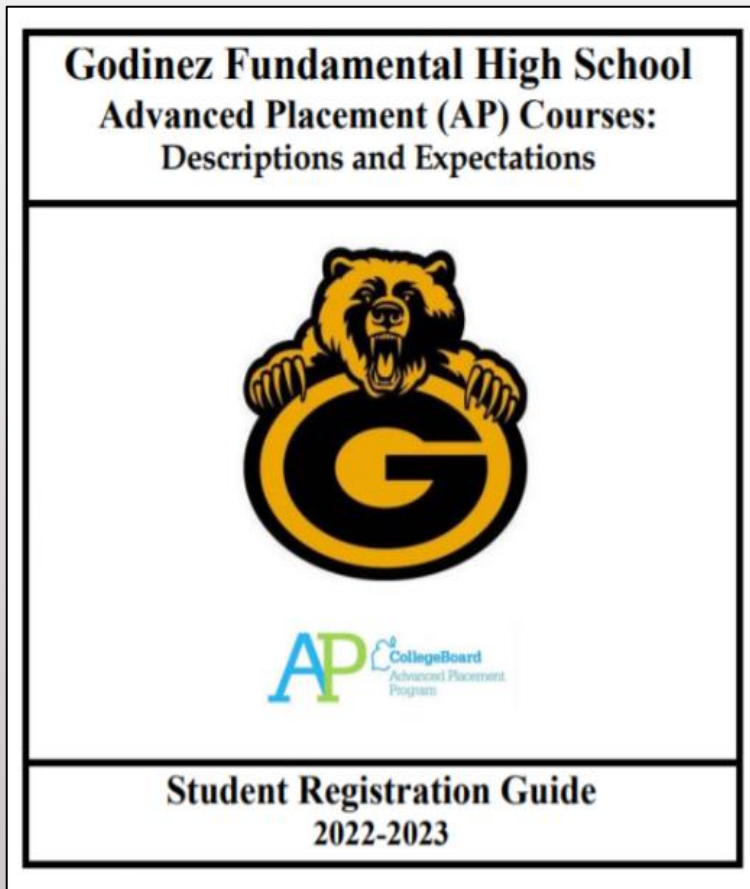

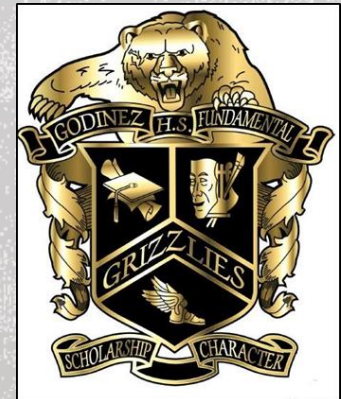

**COURSE DESCRIPTION**

In AP U.S. History, students investigate significant events, individuals, developments, and processes in nine historical periods from approximately 1491 to the present. Students develop and use the same skills and methods employed by historians: analyzing primary and secondary sources; developing historical arguments; making historical connections; and utilizing reasoning about comparison, causation, and continuity and change. The course also provides eight themes that students explore throughout the course in order to make connections among historical developments in different times and places: American and national identity; work, exchange, and technology; geography and the environment; migration and settlement; politics and power; America in the world; American and regional culture; and social structures.

- ✓ **Give students an extra point on their GPA.**

## AP

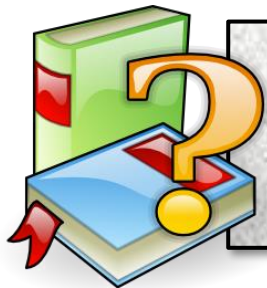
Advanced Placement

- ✓ **Very challenging courses which help prepare students for the rigor of college-level work.**
- ✓ **Give students an extra point on their GPA.**
- ✓ **Have an end-of-year exam.**
- ✓ **Students who score high on the exam MAY receive college credit.**

## Dual Enrollment

- ✓ **These classes are college courses offered through Santa Ana College.**
- ✓ **Give students an extra point on their GPA.**
- ✓ **Students receive both high school and college credit for these courses.**





# Who is Recommended for Honors, AP, & Dual Enrollment?

## Honors

### ✓ Recommended for students who:

- Want to challenge themselves academically
- Want to prepare to take AP and Dual Enrollment courses

## AP

Advanced Placement

### ✓ Recommended for students who:

- Have successfully taken Honors courses
- Are planning on attending a 4-year university
- Have a 3.5 GPA or higher

## Dual Enrollment

### ✓ Recommended for students who:

- Are planning on attending a 2 or 4-year college
- Want to earn college credit while in high school
- Have a strong academic transcript

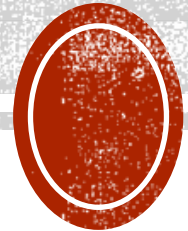

### **The Bad News:**

Students who are behind 20 credits or more are in danger of being sent to **Lorin Griset Academy** or **Cesar Chavez High School** their junior or senior year.

### **The Good News:**



**If you have Ds or Fs, you can attend summer school or Bridge (night school) to recover credits. Talk to your counselor!**



# REMINDER

**If you want to attend a 4-year college or university, you cannot have a D or an F on your transcript.**



**That means 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup>,  
and 12<sup>th</sup> grades.**

# California Physical Education Requirement

## WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

**The State of California requires that all students be enrolled in Physical Education for four years.**

- **Students are able to waive (opt out of) the 4-year requirement if:**
  - They are 16 years old before September 20, 2022, and
  - They have already passed two years of Physical Education.
- **All students must complete a PE Waiver form.**
  - You will complete this waiver during registration with your counselor.

# Do I Need to Take PE My Junior Year?

Will you be 16 (or older) by September 20, 2022?

**Yes**

**You are NOT required to take PE your junior year**

**No**

**You are required to take PE your junior year.**

- You must be in PE until the end of the semester in which you turn 16.
- Most students will only need PE for the first semester.

**YOU MUST COMPLETE THE PE WAIVER**  
**or you will not be released from PE at age 16.**
