





AP United States History

COURSE DESCRIPTION

In AP U.S. History, students investigate significant events, individuals, developments, and processes in nine historical periods from approximately 1491 to the present. Students develop and use the same skills and methods employed by historians: analyzing primary and secondary sources; developing historical arguments; making historical connections; and utilizing reasoning about comparison, causation, and continuity and change. The course also provides eight themes that students explore throughout the course in order to make connections among historical developments in different times and places: American and national identity; work, exchange, and technology; geography and the environment; migration and settlement; politics and power; America in the world; American and regional culture; and social structures.

- Students must pass with an A, B, or C to earn the college credit and this grade can affect your future college financial aid.
- With these courses, you are a considered a college student. If you receive a D or F, the college can put you on academic probation.

Honors

- ✓ Challenging courses which prepare students for the rigor of AP and Dual Enrollment courses.
- ✓ Give students an extra point on their GPA.

APAdvanced Placement

- ✓ Very challenging courses which help prepare students for the rigor of collegelevel work.
- ✓ Give students an extra point on their GPA.
- ✓ Have an end-of-year exam.
- ✓ Students who score high on the exam <u>MAY</u> receive college credit.

Dual Enrollment

- √These classes are college courses offered through Santa Ana College.
- √ Give students an extra point on their GPA.
- ✓ Students receive both high school and college credit for these courses.

✓ Recommended for students who:


- Have successfully taken Honors courses



If you want to attend a 4-year college or university, you cannot have a D or an F on your transcript.



California Physical Education Requirement WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

The State of California requires that all students be enrolled in Physical Education for four years.

- Students are able to waive (opt out of) the 4-year requirement if:
 - They are 16 years old before September 20, 2022, and
 - They have already passed two years of Physical Education.
- <u>All</u> students must complete a PE Waiver form.
 - You will complete this waiver during registration with your counselor.

Do I Need to Take PE My Junior Year?

Will you be 16 (or older) by September 20, 2022?

Yes

You are NOT required to take PE your junior year

No

You are required to take PE your junior year.

- You must be in PE until the end of the semester in which you turn 16.
- Most students will only need PE for the first semester.

YOU MUST COMPLETE THE PE WAIVER or you will not be released from PE at age 16.
