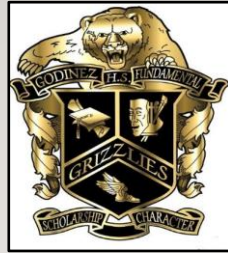

COURSE DESCRIPTION <p>AP Chemistry is equivalent to a college course for first year chemistry majors. This is a second year high school chemistry course that provides in depth study of topics such as the structure of matter, kinetic theory of gases, chemical equilibria, chemical kinetics, and thermodynamics.</p>	
INFORMATION ABOUT THE COURSE <p>All meetings outside normal school hours are optional EXCEPT FOR ONE. Meetings are designed to support students. Dates, times, and number of meetings will depend on identified student needs.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ★ 1-2 days/week before/after school- for student support as needed - optional ★ 5 Saturdays - review/support as needed - optional ★ 1 day during Spring Break OR one day (before break) after school (1 meeting REQUIRED*) <p>* You Must Attend one after school meeting the week before spring break or one day during Spring Break</p> <p>Curricular Requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ A first year chemistry course (or waiver) is required ❖ Complete several chapters of chemistry review as summer homework prior to beginning this course ❖ Work for a minimum of 1 hour per night on problems related to content <p>Additional Comments:</p> <p>→ Students who score a 3, 4, or 5 on the AP Exam at the end of this course are eligible for a retroactive gradeadjustment to A (if applicable) and may be eligible to receive credit for introductory chemistry.</p>

What is Dual Enrollment?

These are college-level courses offered at Godinez that are given in partnership with Santa Ana College.

- The grade you earn will go on your both your high school & your college transcripts.
- Credits are transferrable to Community College, CSU, and UCs.
- Students must pass with an A, B, or C to earn the college credit and this grade can affect your future college financial aid.
- With these courses, you are considered a college student. If you receive a D or F, the college can put you on academic probation.

Differences Between Honors, AP, and Dual Enrollment

Honors

- ✓ Challenging courses which prepare students for the rigor of college-level work.
- ✓ Give students an extra point on their **GPA**.

AP

Advanced Placement

- ✓ Very challenging courses which help students prepare for the rigor of college-level work.
- ✓ Give students an extra point on their **GPA**.
- ✓ Have an end-of-year exam.
- ✓ Students who score high on the exam **MAY** receive college credit.

Dual Enrollment

- ✓ Courses offered through Santa Ana College.
- ✓ Give students an extra point on their **GPA**.
- ✓ Students receive both high school and college credit for these courses.



Who is Recommended for Honors, AP, and Dual Enrollment?

Honors

Recommended for students who:

- Want to challenge themselves academically
- Want an idea of what college-level work is like

AP

Advanced Placement

Recommended for students who:

- Have successfully taken Honors courses
- Are planning on attending a 4-year university
- Have a 3.5 GPA or higher

Dual Enrollment

Recommended for students who:

- Are planning on attending a 2 or 4-year college
- Want to earn college credit while in high school
- Have a strong academic transcript

HONORS, AP, & DUAL ENROLLMENT

The Benefits

1. Demonstrates that you are prepared for college-level work
2. Makes you more competitive for 4-year colleges
3. Looks great on your transcript


The Challenges

1. Requires **a lot of** homework, particularly reading and writing
2. Requires **tutoring** for many students
3. Takes up **a lot of** your time. You will have to manage your time wisely!

CREDIT RECOVERY

- If you are in need of credit recovery, your counselor will be speaking to you.
- Students who are behind 20 credits or more are in danger of being sent to **Lorin Grisette Academy** or **Cesar Chavez High School**.
- Seniors who continue to be credit deficient during senior year will be referred to Grisette or Chavez and will graduate from there.



REMEMBER

- If you want to attend a 4-year college or university, you cannot have a D or an F on your transcript.
- **That means 9th, 10th, 11th, and 12th grades.**

ENGLISH 12

For your English class next year, you will have 5 classes from which to choose.

- **3** classes are CP level
- **2** classes are high-level

3 CP LEVEL ENGLISH 12 CLASSES

English 12

This class focuses on **British Literature** from the birth of the English language.

- You will study works of fiction, such as legends, myths, poetry, etc.
- **Recommended for students who want to attend a community college or certificate program after high school.**

English 12 ERWC

Expository Reading and Writing Course

This course was created by the **CSUs** to help seniors learn the basic skills needed at the college level.

- Focuses on reading, writing, and analyzing non-fiction works, such as speeches, biographies, and historical documents.
- **Recommended for students who plan to attend a CSU or other 4-year university.**

Creative Writing

Find your voice & express yourself!

- Write poetry, short stories, novels, graphic novels & screenplays
- Workshop format--small groups where you will share your work & give feedback to each other
- Publish your work!
- **Recommended for students who plan to attend college and who want to improve their writing skills.**

2 HIGH-LEVEL ENGLISH 12 CLASSES

AP English Literature

This course focuses on a deep analysis of novels, poetry, and other literature, with an emphasis on writing.

- This class is only open to students who have taken AP English Language.

English 101 Freshman Composition

Focus is on organizing and writing essays.

- Dual Enrollment, college-level course
- One semester equals full year of high school English
- **Recommended for students with strong reading and writing skills who are planning on attending a 2 or 4-year college.**

HOW DO I GET A FREE PERIOD, LATE START, OR EARLY DISMISSAL?

Eligibility:

1. Must be meeting all **graduation requirements**
2. Must return the **Free Period Request Form**

Rules:

1. Students in Dual Enrollment may request a free period during the day.
2. All other students may only request a **late start** or **early dismissal**.

If you are planning on applying to competitive 4-year universities, it is recommended that you have six classes your senior year.

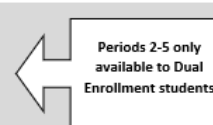

Notes:

- Having a free period is a privilege!
- Students not meeting credit requirements at the end of the first semester will have their free period revoked.
- If the student will be applying to competitive colleges/universities, it is recommended to have six classes senior year.

FAQ'S

Do I have to take science my senior year?

- If you have met your science requirements, you do not need another year of science.
- **HOWEVER**, if you want to go to a four-year college and pursue a career in medicine or science, you *should* take 3-4 years of science in high school.

Do I have to take math my senior year?

- No. You only need 3 years of math to graduate.
- **HOWEVER**, if you want to attend a competitive college or university, you *should* take a 4th year of math.

ONE LAST THING ...

You will be applying to colleges & universities in the fall. They will be evaluating you based on your GPA from 9-11th grades.

- Most UC schools accept students with an average 4.0 GPA.
- Most Cal State Universities accept students with a 3.5 GPA or higher.
- Community colleges accept anyone with a high school diploma.
