AP Chemistry is equivalent to a college course for first year chemistry majors. This is a **second** year high school chemistry course that provides in depth study of topics such as the structure of matter, kinetic theory of gases, chemical equilibria, chemical kinetics, and thermodynamics.

#### INFORMATION ABOUT THE COURSE

#### All meetings outside normal school hours are optional EXCEPT FOR ONE.

Meetings are designed to support students. Dates, times, and number of meetings will depend on identified student needs.

- ★ 1-2 days/week before/after school- for student support as needed optional
- ★ 5 Saturdays review/support as needed optional
- ★ 1 day during Spring Break OR one day (before break) after school (1 meeting REQUIRED\*)

#### Curricular Requirements:

- A first year chemistry course (or waiver) is required
- · Complete several chapters of chemistry review as summer homework prior to beginning this course
- ◆ Work for a minimum of 1 hour per night on problems related to content

#### Additional Comments:

→ Students who score a 3, 4, or 5 on the AP Exam at the end of this course are eligible for a retroactive gradeadjustment to A (if applicable) and may be eligible to receive credit for introductory chemistry.

### **What is Dual Enrollment?**

These are college-level courses offered at Godinez that are given in partnership with Santa Ana College.

- The grade you earn will go on your <u>both your</u> high school & your college transcripts.
- Credits are transferrable to Community College, CSU, and UCs.
- Students must pass with an A, B, or C to earn the college credit and this grade can affect your future college financial aid.
- With these courses, you are a considered a college student. If you receive a D or F, the college can put you on academic probation.



### Differences Between Honors, AP, and Dual Enrollment

### **Honors**

- ✓ Challenging courses which prepare students for the rigor of college-level work.
- ✓ Give students an extra point on their GPA.

#### AP

Advanced Placement

- ✓ Very challenging courses which help students prepare for the rigor of college-level work.
- ✓ Give students an extra point on their GPA.
- ✓ Have an end-of-year exam.
- ✓ Students who score high on the exam MAY receive college credit.

### Dual Enrollment

- ✓ Courses offered through Santa Ana College.
- ✓ Give students an extra point on their GPA.
- ✓ Students receive both high school and college credit for these courses.



# Who is Recommended for Honors, AP, and Dual Enrollment?

### **Honors**

## Recommended for students who:

- Want to challenge themselves academically
- Want an idea of what college-level work is like

#### AΡ

Advanced Placement

## Recommended for students who:

- Have successfully taken Honors courses
- Are planning on attending a 4-year university
- Have a 3.5 GPA or higher

### **Dual Enrollment**

## Recommended for students who:

- Are planning on attending a 2or 4year college
- Want to earn college credit while in high school
- Have a strong academic transcript

# HONORS, AP, & DUAL ENROLLMENT

### The Benefits

- I. Demonstrates that you are prepared for collegelevel work
- 2. Makes you more competitive for 4-year colleges
- 3. Looks great on your transcript

### The Challenges

- I. Requires *a lot of* homework, particularly reading and writing
- 2. Requires **tutoring** for many students
- 3. Takes up **a lot of** your time. You will have to manage your time wisely!

### REMINDER

Grades, GPA, Test Scores, and Teacher Recommendations will be considered to determine placement in high-level courses.

During registration, you and your counselor will have the opportunity to discuss the best placement for you.



- CTE Pathways require two years of classes, therefore seniors cannot start a pathway in their senior year.
- The following classes are available to seniors who started a pathway in 9-1 I<sup>th</sup> grade:



### **CREDIT RECOVERY**

- If you are in need of credit recovery, your counselor will be speaking to you.
- Students who are behind 20 credits or more are in danger of being sent to Lorin Griset Academy or Cesar Chavez High School.
- Seniors who continue to be credit deficient <u>during senior year</u> will be referred to Griset or Chavez and will graduate from there.



### REMEMBER

- If you want to attend a

   have a D or an F on

### ENGLISH 12

For your English class next year, you will have 5 classes from which to choose.

- 3 classes are CP level
- 2 classes are high-level

### **3** CP LEVEL ENGLISH 12 CLASSES

### English 12

This class focuses on British Literature from the birth of the English language.

- You will study works of <u>fiction</u>, such as legends, myths, poetry, etc.
- Recommended for students who want to attend a community college or certificate program after high school.

### **English 12 ERWC**

Expository Reading and Writing Course

This course was created by the CSUs to help seniors learn the basic skills needed at the college level.

- Focuses on reading, writing, and analyzing non-fiction works, such as speeches, biographies, and historical documents.
- Recommended for students who plan to attend a CSU or other 4-year university.

### **Creative Writing**

### Find your voice & express yourself!

- Write poetry, short stories, novels, graphic novels & screenplays
- Workshop format--small groups where you will share your work & give feedback to each other
- Publish your work!
- Recommended for students who plan to attend college and who want to improve their writing skills.

### 2 HIGH-LEVEL ENGLISH 12 CLASSES

# AP English Literature

This course focuses on a deep analysis of novels, poetry, and other literature, with an emphasis on writing.

 This class is only open to students who have taken AP English Language.

# English 101 Freshman Composition

# Focus is on organizing and writing essays.

- Dual Enrollment, college-level course
- One semester equals full year of high school English
- Recommended for students with strong reading and writing skills who are planning on attending a 2 or 4-year college.

# HOW DO I GET A FREE PERIOD, LATE START, OR EARLY DISMISSAL?

### **Eligibility:**

- I. Must be meeting all graduation requirements
- 2. Must return the **Free Period Request Form**

#### **Rules:**

- Students in Dual Enrollment may request a free period during the day.
- 2. All other students may only request a **late start** or **early dismissal**.

If you are planning on applying to competitive 4-year universities, it is recommended that you have six classes your senior year.

# Do I <u>have</u> to take science my senior year?

- If you have met your science requirements, you do not need another year of science.
- HOWEVER, if you want to go to a four-year college and pursue a career in medicine or science, you should take 3-4 years of science in high school.

# FAQ'S

# Do I <u>have</u> to take math my senior year?

- No. You only need 3 years of math to graduate.
- **HOWEVER**, if you want to attend a competitive college or university, you should take a 4<sup>th</sup> year of math.



You will be applying to colleges & universities in the fall. They will be evaluating you based on your GPA from 9-1 Ith grades.

- Most UC schools accept students with an average 4.0 GPA.
- Most Cal State Universities accept students with a 3.5 GPA or higher.
- Community colleges accept anyone with a high school diploma.




### Step 5:


On the left menu, select Course Requests Entry.

Locate the empty box under Filter Courses.






### Step 9:
