Requirements to apply to a CSU or UC

A	History/Social Science	2 years required			
B	English	4 years required			
C	Mathematics	3 years required *4 years recommended			
D	Science	2 years required *3 years recommended			
E	Language Other Than English	2 years required *3 years recommended			
F	Visual & Performing Arts	1 year required			
G	Electives	1 year required			

NOTE ABOUT ELECTIVES: While 1 year is required for 4-year colleges, 50 credits are required to earn your high school diploma.

So You Want To Take an AP or Honors Course?

10th Grade AP Courses:

- ◆ AP European History
- AP Human Geography
 - only for students who took World History Honors
- AP Spanish Language

10th Grade Honors Courses:

- World History Honors
- English 10 Honors
- Geometry Honors
 - not recommended for students who took Algebra I CP
- Algebra II Honors
 - only for students who took Geometry Honors
- Chemistry Honors

AP European History

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course covers a survey of history from the high Renaissance (1450) to the present. The class focuses on the political, cultural, diplomatic, social, economic, artistic, and intellectual historical developments in Europe. Students will take the Advanced Placement exam at the end of the course.

INFORMATION ABOUT THE COURSE

Do you meet outside of normal school hours:

- Ø About 10 days prior to exam, before and/or after school review sessions
- Ø Two Saturday sessions; students take practice AP Exams

Curricular Requirements

Ø Periodic in class long essay questions and document based essay questions

Additional Comments:

Ø Students who score a 3, 4, or 5 on the AP Exam may be eligible for college credit

What are Dual Enrollment courses?

- College-level courses offered through Godinez that are given in partnership with Santa Ana College.
- Students receive <u>high school</u> and <u>college credit</u> for these courses.

Your counselor will be reaching out to you if you are eligible for Dual Enrollment next year.

What You Should Know About AP, Honors, and Dual Enrollment

The Benefits

- Demonstrates that you are prepared for college-level work
- Makes you more competitive for 4-year colleges
- Looks great on your transcript!

The Challenges

- Requires a lot of homework, particularly reading and writing
- Requires tutoring for many students, including attending on Saturdays
- 3. Takes up **a lot of** your time. You may have to sacrifice social activities. You will have to manage your time wisely.

What are the Main Differences Between Honors, AP, & Dual Enrollment Courses?

Honors

- ✓ Challenging courses which prepare students for the rigor of AP & Dual Enrollment courses.
- √ Give students an extra point on their GPA.

AP

Advanced Placement

- ✓ Very challenging courses which help prepare students for the rigor of collegelevel work.
- ✓ Give students an extra point on their GPA.
- √ Have an end-of-year exam.
- ✓ Students who score high on the exam may receive college credit.

Dual Enrollment

- √These classes are college courses offered through Santa Ana College.
- √Give students an extra point on their GPA.
- √Students receive
 both high school
 and college credit
 for these courses.



Who are Honors, AP, & Dual Enrollment Courses Recommended For?

Honors

✓ Recommended for <u>students who:</u>

- Want to challenge themselves academically
- Want to prepare to take AP and Dual Enrollment courses

AP

Advanced Placement

✓ Recommended for students who:

- Have successfully taken Honors courses
- Are planning on attending a 4-year university
- Have a 3.5 GPA or higher

Dual Enrollment

✓ Recommended for students who:

- Are planning on attending a 2-year or 4-year college
- Want to start earning college credit while in high school
- Have a strong academic transcript


Grades, GPA, Test Scores, & Teacher Recommendations will be considered by your counselor to determine placement in high-level courses.

During Registration, you and your counselor will have the opportunity to discuss the best placement for you.



What are CTE classes?

- A-G elective pathways in the <u>Media Arts</u> and <u>Medical</u> fields.
- These classes are for everyone!
- CTE Pathways are a two-year commitment.

PART 2:

Credit Recovery



If you receive a D or an F in an a-g requirement, you will be sent to Bridge (night school) or Summer School to retake the class.

WHY?

- If you receive an F, you will not receive your high school diploma.
- If you receive a D, you will not be eligible for four-year colleges and universities.

The Bad News and the Good News

The Bad News

- Students who are behind 20 credits or more are in danger of being sent to <u>Lorin Griset Academy</u> or <u>Cesar Chavez HS</u> their junior or senior year.
- These are alternative schools for students who have fallen behind on their credits to the extent that they will not be able to finish in time in their regular high school.
- Students must be 16 years old to be sent to these schools.

The Good News and the Bad News

The Good News

If you have Ds or Fs, you can attend summer school or Bridge class (night school) to recover credits. Talk to your counselor!

But isn't a D considered passing?

- Yes. If you receive a D in a class, you will still receive a high school diploma; HOWEVER, you will not be eligible to attend a four-year college or university.
- Your goal should be to aim higher than just a high school diploma. You need to further your education after high school in order to be successful in life.
- THIS is why we send you to retake any Ds you receive in your a-g requirements.




On the left menu, select **Classes**.


On the left menu, select Course Requests




Locate the empty box under Filter Courses.
