Dental Assistant Advanced is the capstone course in a health care pathway for those who wish to become entry-level Dental Assistants. In this course, students will prepare to be certified in Dental Radiation Safety and to meet the Dental Board of California requirements for all unlicensed dental assistants (entry level dental assistants). Students will practice using bisecting and paralleling x-ray techniques in preparation for their certification. In addition, students will learn the necessary soft skills for employment, including proper dress (scrubs). In addition, there is a required 120-hour internship where students work alongside a dentist and his/her patients. **Uniform required**

Students will review the essential knowledge and skills that they mastered in Medical Core, Health Science and Medical Technology and/or Sports Medicine and then expand and focus these for application within the hospital environment by completing an internship at South Coast Global Medical Center. Content topics include: patient care skills, safety and emergency procedures, ethics and specific skills for specialized hospital departments. (CPR) card, physical examination, tuberculosis test and other inoculations/vaccinations are required for internship placement at hospital. **Uniform required**

Students gain practical hands-on experience in Vital Signs, Emergency Medical Care and First Aid and will be certified in CPR. **Uniform required**

Building Trades Readiness Program

This program prepares students for union apprenticeship programs or employment in the trades. Some of the hands-on skills to be taught include; construction framing, electrical, plumbing, and drywall install. Students are trained under the guidelines of Building and Construction Trades Council NABTU nationally recognized as Multi-Craft Curriculum (MC3). At the end of program completion students will receive three industry recognized certificates; Building Trades MC3, 10-hour OSHA Certification, and CPR/First Aid Training Certification. Students will meet union speakers and field trips to local unions will be provided.

Medical Assistant Clinical Advanced

This course is a capstone course designed to produce employable graduates with those competencies necessary to move on to post-secondary education and/or an entry-level medical back office position. Students will practice and perform clinical duties that include taking and recording vital signs and medical histories, preparing patients for examinations, drawing blood, and administering medications as directed by physicians. Students will research and discuss ethical, legal, and professional behavior in a medical office and will adhere to those findings throughout the year. The community classroom internship provides the students with actual supervised experience in a medical office or clinic, to enhance those competencies acquired during classroom theory and laboratory training. **Uniform required**
