Classwork / Homework

- Classwork is all work and activities done in class.
- Homework is any classwork not completed during class.
- Late work is accepted for full credit if the absence is excused. Otherwise, it progressively loses percentage points.
- Make-up work for any given month is due on the last day (28, 30, 31, etc.) of that month.
- Missing work not made up by the deadline become zeroes on the Aeries online gradebook.

Assessments (Quizzes / Tests)

- Quizzes usually will be given at least once per week, covering that week's content.
- Some additional quizzes may be unannounced.
- All or most quizzes will be done on Chromebooks via Google Forms / Google Classroom.
- The final exam will be a quiz on whichever section we finish on.

Extra Credit

- There is <u>NO</u> extra credit in the form of extra work, packets or assignments.
- I do sometimes award extra credit points for work that clearly shows effort, care, and attention to detail.

Required Materials

- <u>Chromebook</u> and, if necessary, its charger (this class is a <u>DIGITAL CLASS</u>, more than 90% online).
- Pencils and or pens, including a red one for occasional, traditional paper-based activities.
- A binder, or space in one, to store the occasional notes we take in class.

Classroom Expectations

Be on time:

- Arrive to class on time and be seated when the bell rings.

- When I ask a question, raise your hand, wait to be called on, then answer. •
- When you answer a question, you have the floor. Therefore, no other person should be talking. •
- No person should talk badly of another student or faculty or staff member in my classroom. Everyone is to be respected for who they are.
- Have all electronics put away, unless permitted by the teacher. .
- NO FOOD OR GUM allowed in class. The ONLY drink that is permitted is water!
- Respect is to be given at all times, in all forms. That means, in communicating, in actions and behaviors, and in regards • to materials and objects in the room.

Academic Dishonesty

Academic dishonesty (cheating) will not be tolerated. Cheating is considered any overt or covert action of copying another student's work and passing it off it as your own. The use of on-line translators and translating programs to translate entire sentences also constitutes academic dishonesty.
