Our School Police Department is a well-trained and highly professional team whose primary mission is to ensure the safety and security of our students, staff and the greater Santa Ana community. The School Police Department operates 24 hours a day, each day of the week, and responds to over 12,000 incidents per year. As a specialty K-12 police agency, our Department is committed to school-based community policing to address campus safety.

Our school personnel are committed to Department and District priorities and provide education, intervention and diversion services to our students and staff.

Through these programs, and in support of District restorative justice practices, our students are provided with opportunities to learn and grow in a safe and secure environment. With School Resource Officers and District Safety Officers assigned to school sites throughout the District, our Department provides a high-profile presence and invaluable resource for our students and staff.

Our commitment to safety and security is a top priority. Our School Police Officers are all accredited by the California Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (P.O.S.T.), in addition to receiving specialized training in school policing and campus law. Department personnel receive extensive, ongoing training in all-hazards emergency preparedness, first aid, and active shooter. We are one of the only School Police agencies in the State who also have fully trained and certified Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) officers. Together with the District, we ensure safety and security

protocols are maintained at all of our school sites.

As a specialized law enforcement agency, our Department is committed to working closely with our law enforcement partners and other first responders to ensure the overall safety and security of our entire District and the community of Santa Ana. We will work diligently to maintain the public trust through exemplary police services, accountability and transparency.

I am proud to serve as your Chief of Police and can assure you our Department will be vigilant and steadfast in our commitment to the safety and security of students and staff.





Emergency Preparedness and Training

Recognizing that disasters and man-made incidents can occur at any time, often with little or no warning, the Santa Ana School Police Department, in conjunction with the District's Risk Management Department have engaged in several cooperative ventures to ensure that the District is ready and capable of handling emergency situations involving students, staff, property and the community at large.

The primary objective of the Santa Ana School Police Department, during any emergency, is preservation of life and property. This mission can only be accomplished with the support of the Santa Ana Unified School District Governing Board and the Superintendent.

Training is an essential component of preparedness and greatly affects the Department's ability to respond to, and recover from, a critical incident. The District's Emergency Management Coordinator is responsible to ensure compliance with local, state and federal agencies, while providing the officers with timely and relevant training.

PUBLIC AWARENESS AND EDUCATION

The District and the School Police Department actively promote public awareness and education in order to strengthen overall preparedness and resiliency. By providing the District community education, outreach, training, and coordination, the Santa Ana School Police Department increases the ability of students and District personnel to adequately prepare for and meet their own needs. In 2016, the Santa Ana School Police Department produced a video, "Surviving a School Shooting... Run, Hide and Fight" to bring awareness and prepare students, staff and officers. Patrol

The Santa Ana School Police Department is the 3rd largest school police agency in the State of California, while at the same time serving the 7th largest school district in the State and the largest in Orange County. The Santa Ana School Police Department stands alone as the only California Peace Officer Standards and Training Commission (POST) recognized specialty school police department in Orange County; providing 24-hour police services to over 50,000 students and 4,654 staff members.

School Police Officers are prepared to respond to both emergency and non-emergency calls for service 24-hours a day and provide mutual aid assistance to allied agencies. Patrol officers handle the majority of the calls for service, which allow the School Resource Officers to remain on their campus and not compromise the security posture of the school site. In the 2016/2017 school year, officers responded to 12, 669 incidents.

The Santa Ana School Police Department is committed to continuing to provide a safe and secure learning and working environment. The Department has transformed itself to an innovative, responsive and professional organization that values the service it provides. Through collaborative partnerships established with other law enforcement agencies and the community at large, the Santa Ana School Police Department positioned itself to better serve and respond to the needs of the Santa Ana Unified School District, the Santa Ana community, and our society's most precious asset: it's children.







School Resource Officers

The Santa Ana School Resource Officers (SRO's) are community-oriented police officers with the skills to build relationships, solve problems, and enforce the law. The SRO's provide law enforcement and police services to the school and the surrounding community. They work closely with school administrators to develop and implement classes in law-related education to support educational efforts.



The SRO focuses on preventing juvenile delinquency through close contact and building positive relationships with students. They also create partnerships with school administrators, in order to provide a safe school environment.



Santa Ana Unified School District's approach to a SRO program is auspicious, due to it enabling communities and schools to address school violence together with both prevention and intervention techniques. School Resource Officer programs are proactive, solution-based, and community driven. Having a SRO on a school campus may prevent problems from happening. It enhances a school's capacity to address its safety and security concerns promptly. When problems do arise, SRO's can intervene quickly to address what is taking place. SRO's are an integral part and contribute to safe school planning efforts, and offer their schools a resource to turn to when emergencies occur.

Santa And School Police Officers engage and cultivate positive relationships with students and their families through a strong foundation of the School Resource Officer Triad concept, which consists of:

- > Teacher
- Counselor
- > Law Enforcement Officer

District Safety Officers

The Santa Ana School District has 38 District Safety Officers (DSO's) deployed at comprehensive high schools and intermediate schools. DSO's work with several school site staff members and assist in maintaining a safe learning and working environment. The DSO program works within the School Police team philosophy concept, which brings together a demonstrated professional security image. District Safety Officers are an integral part of our Department's support structure that allows for us to accomplish our collective policing and safety mission.

DSO's provide their patrol duties in a variety of ways. They are deployed on bicycles, through foot patrol and on golf carts. The DSO Bicycle Program is led by a School Police Officer, who has extensive training on the use and deployment tactics of bicycle riding; he is a Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) certified instructor

The duties of our District Safety Officers include, providing security and crime prevention measures on and around the immediate perimeter of their assigned school campus. Along with assisting School Police Officers, this strategy is primarily accomplished through the following model:

Prevention

District Safety Officers are a vital resource in crime prevention and maintaining order. Proactive, highly visible District Safety Officers leverage the ability of security teams.

> Observation

District Safety Officers are trained in observing and recording pertinent information when crimes occur, documenting crime trend information and preventive strategies.

> Reporting

District Safety Officers are essential in reporting information to site administrators and School Police Officers to ensure for the safety of students and staffs.
