

Flexibility and Mandate Relief





Recommendations

- 1. Move to suspend non-classroom based mandated programs to allow flexibility in the use of funds for the 2008-09 and 2009-10 school years
- 2. Authorize flexibility in the use of categorical funds to focus on classroom based instruction, counseling, libraries and tutoring
- Create a Statewide taskforce to restructure the State Budget and Educational funding methodology to create a more stable mechanism that is not impacted by wild fluctuations in the economy
- 4. Contact the Governor's Office and each legislator to share this message and presentation
- 5. Demand that the Legislature put our children first in priority of funding and not allow California to drop to 50th among all States in Education funding
