1.0	The appropriate date of readmission to school, following a common communicable disease, shall be determined by referral to the latest published regulations of communicable disease by the Orange County Health for control Care Agency.			
2.0		common communicable dis as follows: Chickenpox	seases and their periods of isolation 7 days after first appearance of skin legions.	
	2.2	Conjunctivitis (pink eye, red eye)	Exclude during acute stage with extreme redness and watering of eyes and, or when "crusting" of eyelids persist. (Do not confuse with chronic blepharitis granulated eyelids and/or styes.)	
	2.3	Impetigo	As long as "weeping" or "pus" persists.	
	2.4	Mumps	Until swelling subsides, not to exceed 9 days from onset of swelling.	
	2.5	Pediculosis	As long as nits are found in hair.	
	2.6	Pinworms	Not required.	
	2.7	Ringworm (body)	None, if lesions are under treatment and covered.
