Thank you to all of our teachers for being accommodating to our Testing Block Schedule, and a special thanks to our Math and Language Arts teachers for administering the SBAC test to our students. While we have been focusing on literacy this school year, looking forward to next year, I believe that we agree as a staff that EL strategies need to be at the forefront of our planning. Regarding reclassification numbers, in the 2014-15 school year, we were able to reclassify 22.4% (122 students) of our EL students while in the 2015-16 school year, we reclassified only 11.8% (58 students). This school year, with our focus on literacy, we are anticipating reclassifying about 80 students, but I believe that we can and should help all of our students regardless of the subject we teach. I have been looking through materials from WiDA (wida.us), an organization which is a resource for supporting the education of language learners, and would like to implement some of the ideas school-wide and within individual classrooms. Many of our teachers are already participating in these strategies, including multi-level reading materials (newsela, Encyclopedia Britannica, myON), and focus on academic language instruction (Word Walls, vocabulary). However, I believe that we have the capacity to more effectively help our ELs. In looking at our students' and their grades, we can see trends in where they seem to flourish, how they show what they know, and where they have encountered challenges. We can also consider where academic language development may be hindering academic achievement, or how to help academic achievement despite developing academic language. This is the direction that I would like to see our departments and grade levels moving towards.

In continuing to ready ourselves for next school year, your admin team has been working to bring our 2017-18 school year enrollment as high as possible by visiting the local elementary schools during their Open House nights. We have visited Jackson, Martin, Adams and King so far and will be attending Sepulveda, Diamond, Harvey and Monte Vista for their upcoming Open Houses. During our visits we gave away free popcorn to all of our incoming 6th graders and raffled Carr Spirit Wear. Our incoming sixth graders are very happy and looking forward to joining the Carr Family.

However, in finishing the current school year as strongly as possible, we do want to continue to do as much as we can to help all students to achieve their highest potential. As I mentioned last week, our High School Readiness rates improved greatly and are among the highest in the district. As staff members, we have all been publicizing the message of 2.5 or higher GPA and no Ds or Fs in Language Arts and Math, and I believe that this has been making a solid impact on our students. Last year, in preparation for 8th Grade Promotion, despite the increased expectations, our students reached the Promotion rate of the previous year. We are currently on track to have a greater percentage of our 8th graders promote, and I anticipate that the more we encourage our students to stretch, the more that they will meet our expectations. In our last 6 week period of the year, let's encourage all of our students to continue to do their best and to reach their goals in and outside of school.
