READMISSION OF STUDENT HAVING A MINOR COMMUNICABLE DISEASE

- 1.0 The appropriate date of readmission to school, following a common communicable disease, shall be determined by referral to the latest published regulations of communicable disease by the Orange County Health for control Care Agency.
- 2.0 The common communicable diseases and their periods of isolation are as follows:
 - 2.1 Chickenpox 7 days after first appearance of skin lesions.
 - 2.2 Conjunctivitis (pink eye, red eye) Exclude during acute stage with extreme redness and watering of eyes and, or when "crusting" of eyelids persist. (Do not confuse with chronic blepharitis granulated eyelids and/or styes.)
 - 2.3 Impetigo As long as "weeping" or "pus" persists.
 - 2.4 Mumps Until swelling subsides, not to exceed 9 days from onset of swelling.
 - 2.5 Pediculosis As long as nits are found in hair.
 - 2.6 Pinworms Not required.
 - 2.7 Ringworm (body) None, if lesions are under treatment and covered.
- 3.0 The major or less common communicable diseases requiring a physician's written clearance for return to school are as follows:
 - 3.1 Rubella (3-day measles)
 - 3.2 Rubeola (measles)
 - 3.3 Whooping cough
 - 3.4 Scabies
- 4.0 Decisions regarding the admission to school or the continuance of attendance at school of a pupil with any other communicable disease not addressed previously will be made on an individual basis in accordance with the guidelines outlined in Board Policy 5113 and the District Guidelines and Procedures for Preventing the Spread of Infectious Disease.
