Enrollment

Q: If we choose to have our children do virtual learning until they get vaccinated will they be able to go back to school in person? Will children attending schools with a lottery keep their spots?

A: To limit your student's disruption to learning and grading calendars, we recommend switching learning models at either semester (Intermediate and Secondary) or trimester (Elementary). Students and parents may work directly with school sites to determine enrollment confirmation for return to in-person classes.

Q: What will online classes look like for those not returning in person?

A: Santa Ana Virtual Academy will offer standards-aligned, academic classes that are required for high school graduation and college admission. Students may take K-12 courses fully online including AVID, Speech and Debate, Career Technical Education, Art, Physical Education and Advanced Placement Courses.

Q: My student has special needs with an IEP (Individualized Educational Plan). Is my student able to enroll?

A: Yes, students with IEPs are able to enroll. IEP meetings will be conducted to review support within the virtual learning environment.

Q: Can my student take classes at Virtual Academy AND my home school?

A: Yes, if your student's schedule permits.

Q: Can my student play sports?

A: Yes, your student can play sports at their home school. Students should reach out to their home school coaches and staff to coordinate schedules and eligibility.

Q: Where is the Santa Ana Virtual Academy located?

A: Currently, SAVA is coordinated at the SAUSD District Office. New location is coming soon.
